Estonia joins European initiative to develop supercomputers



On the 24th of August Estonia has become the 21st European country to sign the European declaration on high-performance computing (HPC). The aim is to pool European and national resources to build and deploy world-class supercomputers that would be ranked in the world's top three by 2022-2023.

High-performance computing is needed to process ever larger amounts of data and help researchers make scientific breakthroughs in many areas from healthcare and renewable energy to car safety and cybersecurity.

The EuroHPC Joint Undertaking will pool investments to establish leading European supercomputers and big data infrastructure. The Joint Undertaking aims to acquire systems with pre-exascale performance (a hundred million billion or 10¹⁷ calculations per second) by 2020, and support the development of exascale (a billion billion or 10¹⁸ calculations per second) performance systems based on European technology by 2022-2023.

Why is the world so green? What can we eat to prevent dementia? Are our eyes really the windows to our personalities? 403 talented early career researchers have been awarded European Research Council grants to answer such questions.

Scientists will benefit from EUR 603 million in total and up to EUR 1.5 million each, to create their own research teams and conduct pioneering projects.

Commission promotes greater participation of businesses in regional innovation strategies

The Commission has given the green-light for the continuation of a support action aiming to improve regional innovation systems in low-growth and low-income regions in Romania, Bulgaria, Poland, Hungary, Greece, Italy, Portugal, Spain and Croatia.

Coordinated by the Commission's department for Regional and Urban policy and the Joint Research Centre, the initiative helps regions tackle bottlenecks to innovation, such as lack of interaction between local business spheres and academia, and achieve industrial transition. It will particularly focus on promoting a greater involvement of business partners and entrepreneurs in the design and implementation of regional innovation strategies, known as smart specialisation strategies.

Developed jointly with the European Parliament and implemented over 2014-2016, the action is renewed for two more years, to help regions prepare for efficient investments in research and innovation in the next long term EU budget 2021-2027.

It is complementary to other initiatives, such as 'Stairway to Excellence', which helps regions identify EU resources to finance innovative projects and pair up with other regions with similar assets to create innovation clusters. The support action has a budget €3 million for 2018-2019 made available by the European Parliament.

Commission takes further action to improve consumer protection against toxic substances



On 11 July 2018 the Commission took action to restrict the placing on the market of articles containing four phthalates: DEHP, DBP, BBP and DIBP.

These substances are commonly present in plasticised materials and found in a wide variety of everyday products, from toys to sport equipment.

Phthalates are substances of high concern known for their toxic effects on reproductive health.

According to the proposed restriction presented in the REACH Committee, the four phthalates may not be present in articles used by consumers or available in indoor areas in a concentration equal to or above 0.1% by weight individually or in any combination in any plasticised material. The restriction proposal takes into account the cumulative effects and combined exposure to the 4 phthalates from different articles.

The REACH Committee, composed of experts from all Member States, supported the proposed measure by unanimity. The European Parliament and the Council now have 3 months to scrutinise the measure before its adoption by the Commission.

The restriction will then be published in the Official Journal of the European Union and will apply 18 months after the entry into force to products produced both in and outside of the EU.

The College of Commissioners has today decided to register a European Citizens' Initiative entitled 'Stop starvation for 8% of the European population'.

The stated objectives of the proposed Citizens' Initiative include "to prompt governments to embrace the hunger problem" and to "emphasize the responsibility of governments to eradicate the problem."

The European Investment Bank (EIB) has signed a EUR 40 million loan agreement with French biotechnology company Nanobiotix, a Euronext Tech40 company and nanomedicine enterprise that has developed a technology to enhance existing oncology treatment and to potentially bring a new dimension to cancer therapies.

Juncker Plan renews support for windfarms in Greece

The EIB has signed a €24 million financing agreement with the Greek Terna Energy Group to help fund the development, construction and operation of two windfarms on Mount Vermio in northern Greece.

Alpha Bank acted as co-lender providing an equivalent amount of long-term debt next to a medium term VAT facility.

The EIB's loan is backed under the EU budget guarantee of the European Fund for Strategic Investments (EFSI), the financial instrument of the Investment Plan for Europe. This is the second such agreement with Terna following one last July to finance windfarms in the Viotia region.



The two windfarms will have a combined operating capacity of 44.4 MW, divided between Eressou Ipsoma-Fourka (operating capacity 36MW) and Lefkes-Kerasia (operating capacity of 8.4MW). Combined, they will host 22 wind turbines installed on complex high altitude terrain (exceeding 1.400m), and will be connected to the transmission grid via a new MV/HV Substation and respectively 8.5 km and 16km of

MV underground cable.

Commission approves Greek support mechanism for flexible power capacity



The European Commission has found the planned Greek mechanism to remunerate flexible electricity capacity to be in line with EU State aid rules.

Under this mechanism, flexible power capacity providers such as gas-fired power plants, flexible hydro plants and, in a second stage, demand response and storage operators can obtain a payment for being available to generate electricity or, in the case of demand response operators, for being ready to reduce their electricity consumption.

This flexibility in power capacity will allow the Greek transmission system operator (TSO) to cope with the variability in electricity production and consumption, in particular during evening hours, when decreasing solar energy generation coincides with increasing demand for electricity.

To limit costs, the TSO will select the flexible capacity providers through competitive auctions, with a maximum tendered volume of 4,500 megawatts. The measure will apply until the end of 2019.

EU-U.S. Joint Statement of 25 July: European Union imports of U.S. Liquefied Natural Gas (LNG) are on the rise

Since the arrival of the first U.S. LNG carrier in the Portuguese port of Sines April 2016 and August 2018, EU imports of liquefied natural gas from the U.S. have increased from zero to 2.8 billion cubic meters.

In order to increase imports to Europe further, U.S. prices for liquefied natural gas need to be competitive on the EU market.

In addition, the following actions are key to facilitating imports:

- Development of liquefied natural gas capacities in the EU and in the U.S.:



- Regulatory restrictions by the U.S. need to be lifted

This year's edition confirms the ongoing positive labour market trends as well as an improving social situation. The numbers of people in employment reached new record levels. With almost 238 million people having a job, employment has never been higher in the EU.



affected, compared with 2012. But looking at the impact of technological developments, there are uncertainties about the future effects of automation and digitalisation. This is why the 2018 ESDE review is dedicated to the changing world of work.

This year's edition of the report aims to analyse opportunities and risks linked to technological innovation, demographic change, and globalisation.

In 2017 over three and a half million more people were in employment, compared with 2016. However, while the number of hours worked per person employed has grown in recent years, they are still below the 2008 levels. At the same time we witness rising disposable incomes and lower levels of poverty. Severe material deprivation has receded to an all-time low, with 16.1 million fewer people

The review shows what needs to happen so that everybody can benefit from these developments.

Managing migration: Commission expands on disembarkation and controlled centre concepts

Following the call by EU leaders at the June European Council, the Commission is today expanding on the concept of controlled centres as well as short-term measures that could be taken to improve the processing of migrants being disembarked in the EU, and giving a first outline of the possible way forward for the establishment of regional disembarkation arrangements with third countries.



could have a temporary or ad-hoc nature depending on the location. The main features of such centres are:

- full operational support
- rapid, secure and effective processing
- full financial support

'Controlled Centres' in the EU

To improve the orderly and effective processing of those disembarked in the European Union, EU leaders have called for the establishment of 'controlled centres' in the EU.

The Commission will also provide a central contact point to coordinate among Member States taking part in solidarity efforts – as an interim measure until a fully-fledged system can be established in the context of the ongoing Common European Asylum System reforms.

The resolution calls for all Member States to safeguard the rights and interests of children when implementing their respective migration policies, taking into consideration the unique challenges faced by child refugees and asylum seekers, such as vulnerability to exploitation, violence and sexual abuse.

Digital transformation: challenge and opportunity for migrant workers

The digital transformation, from robotics to artificial intelligence, is transforming our jobs.

It is opening up new working opportunities as our societies become more technologically advanced. At the same time, computers could soon be replacing humans and performing their tasks across a number of sectors.

In this context, the European Pillar of Social Rights focuses on inclusive education and training policies, the importance of which has been confirmed through the EU's Skills Agenda for Europe and the European Education Area.

Money Market Funds: Better rules to ensure financial stability and investor protection



On 21 July 2018 the new EU rules on money market funds enter into application. Money market funds are short-term investments used by corporates, universities, hospitals and investors to manage their surplus cash, often as an alternative to a bank account.

During the last financial crisis, money market funds proved vulnerable under stressed market conditions. This is why the European Parliament and the Council agreed to make these funds more resilient and limit possible contagion channels to other financial entities and the financial system in general.

Uniform rules and supervisory practice across the EU aim to ensure that money market funds are able to pay out investors at all times. This will in turn contribute to enhanced financial stability in Europe. All funds pursuing a money market fund investment strategy, which were operating before the entry into force of this Regulation on 21 July 2017, will have to demonstrate their compliance with the new rules by 21 January 2019.

Commission engages with stakeholders in meeting of the Advisory Group on EU Trade Agreements

The Commission on 11 July 2018 hold the third meeting of the Advisory Group on EU Trade Agreements, a body created in September 2017 to allow the Commission to foster in-depth dialogue with civil society and gather more easily different perspectives and insights from a wide and balanced group of stakeholders.

In its third meeting, the group composed of 28 organisations representing businesses, trade unions, consumers and environmental groups will discuss the implementation of the EU-Canada Comprehensive Trade Agreement (CETA) in the preparation of the CETA Joint Committee scheduled for September 2018; issues related to cross-border data flows and personal data protection in trade and investment negotiations, as well as consumer issues in trade agreements, including those related to public health. More details about the meeting are available online.

The report of the meeting will be published in the following days. The advisory group builds on the Commission's long-standing, active dialogue with civil society on trade issues and other transparency mechanisms, including regular publication of EU negotiating proposals, in line with commitments made in the "Trade for All" strategy of 2015.
