Promoting Hybrid Photovoltaic and Energy Storage Systems in Residential Dwellings in Cyprus: The European Research Project Stores

The StoRES project focuses on the Photovoltaic (PV) technology coupled with energy storage and, more specifically, on the implementation of hybrid PV and Energy Storage Systems (ESS) in households and small communities in

Mediterranean countries with a high solar irradiance potential. The main objective of the project is to enhance the self-consumption of PV generation in this area, while solving technical problems and market, network and pricing issues, without affecting the stability and reliability of the power network. Storing excess PV generation for later use could be a way of increasing the use of RES and tackling congestion in the distribution network, while improving its reliability and enhancing the further development of power systems. The project started in November 2016 and has a duration of 36 months.

Member States' Compliance with EU Law in 2018: Efforts are paying off, but Improvements still needed

The 4th of July Annual report on Monitoring the Application of EU law sets out how the Commission monitored and enforced EU law in 2018. The online Single Market Scoreboard, also published the same day, evaluates the performance of EU/EEA countries in the EU single market and identifies the shortcomings where the countries and the Commission should step up their efforts.

Citizens and businesses can only enjoy the many benefits of the single market if the rules that have been jointly agreed actually work on the ground. In November 2018, the Commission presented a fresh assessment of remaining barriers in the single market and called on Member States to be vigilant in implementing, applying and enforcing EU rules and refrain from putting up new barriers. For instance, from car emissions to e-commerce, from social media to the services sector, and much more besides.

Council adopts its position on draft 2020 EU Budget

The Council of Ministers has adopted its position on the draft EU budget for 2020, calling for cuts in next year's Horizon 2020 allocation. While the Council's position still envisages a 3.73% increase of the Horizon 2020 budget when compared to 2019, the €12.8 billion budget proposed by the ministers is €413 million less than what the Commission originally proposed in early June (€13.2 billion). The Council has suggested cuts in areas such as the ERC (€119 million), NMBP (€60 million) and Research Infrastructures (€12 million) among others.

The budget for Erasmus+ sees no changes and remains at €2.8 billion, as proposed by the Commission earlier this year.

European Institute of Innovation and Technology: Commission Proposes Strategy for 2021-2027

On July 11, the European Commission has proposed an update of the legal base of the European Institute of Innovation and Technology (EIT) as well as its new Strategic Innovation Agenda for 2021-2027. The EIT is an independent EU body created in 2008 that is strengthening Europe's ability to innovate. The proposals adopted today will align the EIT with the EU's next research and innovation programme Horizon Europe (2021-2027) delivering on the Commission's commitment to further boost Europe's innovation potential. With a proposed

budget of €3 billion, which represents an increase of €600 million or 25% compared to the current Strategic Innovation Agenda (2014-2020), the EIT will fund activities of existing and new Knowledge and Innovation Communities (KICs) and support the innovation capacity of 750 higher education institutions.

Commission launches work on major Research and Innovation missions for Cancer, Climate, Oceans and Soil

On July 4th, Commissioner for Research, Science and Innovation Carlos Moedas officially launched the work on five major European research and innovation missions that will be part of Horizon Europe, the next EU research and innovation programme.

Inspired by the Apollo 11 mission to put a man on the moon, the European R&I missions aim to deliver solutions to some of the greatest challenges facing our world, such as cancer, climate change, healthy oceans, climate-neutral cities and healthy soil and food.

At the occasion of the Informal Council for Research Ministers in Helsinki, Finland, Commissioner Moedas announced the appointment of five prominent experts to chair the mission boards, which will propose targets and timelines to design the specific missions.

Future and Emerging Technologies in Horizon 2020 – Nearly 1 B€ still to be spent on the Technologies of the Future

The European Commission has adopted and published the updated work programme for Horizon 2020, including the part on Future and Emerging Technologies (FET). From now until the end of Horizon 2020, nearly 1 B€ will support high-risk interdisciplinary research on the technologies of the future.

The update provides full detail on the calls and topics for the rest of 2019 and 2020, notably for FET Proactive, international cooperation on HPC (with Latin America) and Quantum (with the US, Canada and Japan), a topic for complementary research under the Quantum Flagship, a topic for training and education and an ERA-Net Cofund on Quantum Technologies, and a pilot line for graphene and related 2D materials.

Commission seeks input on Global Navigation Satellite Systems under Horizon Europe

The European Commission is looking for input on the design of potential 'upstream' Global Navigation Satellite Systems (GNSS) activities under the next Framework Programme: Horizon Europe. Within Horizon Europe, R&D activities will be carried out in the so-called 'upstream' part of satellite navigation, i.e. in the areas of EGNSS mission, services, infrastructure and technology.

In this context, the Directorate General for Internal Market, Industry, Entrepreneurship and SMEs (DG GROW) is launching a call for expressions of ideas, with the objective of gathering recommendations in satellite navigation upstream R&D activities. The consultation takes the form of a questionnaire, which can be accessed via the DG GROW website and feedback is invited from stakeholders within industry, SMEs, academia and research institutes.

Research funding agencies in Central Europe Team Up to Boost Regional Cooperation

The Austrian Science Fund, the Czech Science Foundation, Poland's National Science Centre and the Slovenian Research Agency have formed a partnership to boost cooperation in the region through joint funding and evaluation of cross-border research projects.

The Central European Science Partnership (CEUS) builds on a cooperation that started seven years ago between the Slovenian Research Agency (AARS) and the Austrian Science Fund, in which the two agreed on the mutual recognition of their procedures for evaluating research funding calls.

The four agencies have agreed to boost collaboration, opening the way for researchers in central Europe to form cross-border collaborations and propose bilateral or trilateral research projects. At the same time as increasing the scale of projects and pooling expertise, the agreement is expected to significantly reduce the administrative burden for research teams of submitting proposals.

The European Parliament Industry, Research and Energy committee (ITRE) has elected Adina-Ioana Vălean, a member of Romania's National Liberal Party, as its chair.

Vălean was named last week as the choice of the European People's Party, the largest grouping, and she was elected unopposed. She remains a member of ENVI, the environment, public health and food safety committee, which she chaired in the

last parliament. Vălean has taken over from the previous chair, former Polish prime minister Jerzy Buzek, also of the EPP, who remains a committee member.

Horizon 2020 Work Programme to Kick-Start a Large-Scale Research Initiative on Future Battery Technologies

The updated Horizon 2020 Work Programme provides €47 million to kick-start the large-scale research initiative on future battery technologies previously announced in the Commission Strategic Action Plan for Batteries. At the dawn of a new, connected and green era — represented by autonomous vehicles, smart cities, smart grids based on renewable energy sources, drone aircraft and robotic devices — reliable and safe batteries with ultra-high performance are becoming essential.

The Cross Cutting part of the Horizon 2020 Work Programme adopted by the European Commission on 2 July allocates €42 million to kick-start a large-scale research initiative on future battery technologies. It is part of a broader support — worth €132 million — to short, medium and long term research on batteries within the H2020 call 'Building a Low-Carbon, Climate Resilient Future: Next-Generation Batteries' (H2020-LC-BAT-2019-2020). Europe's Strategic action plan on batteries published by the European Commission in May 2018 led to the publication in December 2018 of the Battery 2030 Manifesto, outlining the vision, rationale and main priorities of this initiative.

Quantum Ecosystem taking shape after onrush of Funding in Europe

Almost a year after an onrush of public investment in quantum research in Europe, there is evidence that an ecosystem is starting to take shape. The UK was an early mover in quantum technologies, launching a £270 million national programme in 2013. On 11 of July, the government announced a further £94 million funding for the second phase of research at quantum hubs centred at Birmingham, Glasgow, Oxford, and York universities. Birmingham's share of the new funding is £23.5 million. The hubs now involve collaborations

between 26 universities and over 100 industry partners. The government says its funding has pulled in over £200 million of investment from the private sector.

COST action updates

At the end of June, COST's Executive Board bid farewell to their outgoing President, Prof. Dr Sierd A.P.L. Cloetingh, and welcomed in Prof. Paulo Ferrão as the new President of the COST Association. Currently a Professor at the University of Lisbon's Instituto Superior Técnico, Prof. Ferrão's mandate at COST will run for the next two years, starting from 21 June 2019.

With respect to the current open COST call which is due to close on 5 September 2019, COST have confirmed that UK participants will continue to have the opportunity to propose, lead, and participate in all Actions. Indeed, the UK has secured a decision from the COST Committee of Senior Officials, that the UK could remain a COST full member country even in the event of a no-deal. The Department for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy (BEIS) advice to prospective candidates is to apply as normal. In the event of success they should not seek election of the Grant Holder position in any COST Action until further notice. Official guidance on how to handle the upcoming call is being sought from COST.

European Union becomes an observer to Council of Europe's anti-corruption Body Greco

The Committee of Ministers representing the 47 Member States of the Council of Europe on July 10 adopted a decision accepting a request by the European Union to become an observer with the Group of States against Corruption (GRECO).

Welcoming this decision, the First Vice-President of the European Commission, Frans Timmermans, said: "The European Union's participation in the GRECO as an observer brings the European Union and the Council of Europe closer and reinforces our joint efforts to strengthen the rule of law and fight against corruption across Europe."

EU and Canada commit to Strengthening Cooperation on R&I

In July, at the EU-Canada Summit in Montreal, both actors reaffirmed their commitment to strengthen cooperation on science, technology and innovation. In a joint declaration, EU and Canadian leaders acknowledged the importance of R&I cooperation in tackling societal challenges and promoting sustainable development, and committed to strengthening mutually beneficial collaboration by pursuing shared priorities and developing joint initiatives under Horizon Europe, as well as other European and Canadian programmes.

Canada also decided to allocate up to \$50 million over five years under its New Frontiers in Research Fund specifically to support Canadian participation in international teams applying for funding through Horizon 2020 and its successor Horizon Europe. Under Horizon 2020, Canada does not automatically qualify to receive EU funding and Canadian entities must either cover their own costs or rely on regional funding. However, in a highly fragmented funding system, only limited regional support has been established to date and a dedicated country-wide funding scheme will help Canadian researchers fully benefit from EU Framework Programmes.

Commission launches Public Consultation for Digital Europe Plan

The European Commission launched a public consultation on the direction of the first two years of its new, seven-year Digital Europe infrastructure plan. Digital Europe proposes to invest €9.2 billion in supercomputing, artificial intelligence, cybersecurity, advanced digital skills, and societal uptake of new technology. The public's views will help shape the programme's work plans and calls for proposals for 2021-2022. The plan wants to get Europe using and developing more of its own technology rather than relying on US or Asian products and services. Strengthening Europe's infrastructure in computing and communications, in the face of dominant US and Asian competitors, is a prime aim. The Commission wants the EU contribution of €9.2 billion to be matched by participating member states.

€119 million to enhance excellence in Research Institutions in Widening Countries

Two calls for projects proposals of the 'Spreading Excellence and Widening Participation' Programme open on 24 July 2019 with deadline of 14 November 2019. It is the only Programme in Horizon 2020 where the coordinator must come exclusively from a widening country – with Research & Innovation (R&I) performance below 70% of the EU average.

The ERA Chairs call looks for projects aiming to bring outstanding academics to universities and research institutes to fulfil the potential to produce excellent research, as well as implementing the structural changes necessary to achieve excellence on a sustainable basis. The budget available for the ERA Chairs call is €50 million.

The Twinning call looks for projects linking an institution from a widening country with at least two internationally leading counterparts in Europe. Activities like short-term staff exchanges, expert visits, on-site or virtual trainings, workshops, conference attendances, dissemination and outreach in any field of research are supported. The budget available for the Twinning call is €69 million.

European Commission joint research centre opens World-Class laboratories to Researchers

Researchers from across Europe will now have even more opportunities to use the Joint Research Centre's state-of-the-art facilities: after a first round of the open access initiative, in which nearly 100 eligible proposals were received from 92 research institutions, further laboratories of the Commission's in-house science and knowledge service are now available to external scientists. They will now also be able to run experiments on zero emission energy solutions and nuclear safety. With this initiative, the JRC aims to boost scientific research and competitiveness

as well as increasing cooperation between European researchers.

UK Science Minister Sees 'Glimmer of Hope' in Brexit talks on Research

UK science minister, Chris Skidmore, says there's now a "glimmer of hope" for reaching a flexible future research relationship with the EU, following last week's decision by Brussels to extend grant payments to UK-based researchers even in the event of a no-deal Brexit. In an emergency measure, Brussels beginning of July agreed that UK organisations could be eligible for EU funding for the last two months of 2019, even if the country leaves without a deal on October 31. Without this arrangement, EU research funding to the UK would have ceased overnight. Under the new arrangement, the EU would continue making payments to UK beneficiaries for contracts signed and decisions made before the withdrawal date, as long as the UK continues paying its contribution agreed in the EU budget for 2019.

Step by Step, world leaders strive to find consensus on AI development

Around the world, excitement about artificial intelligence (AI) is spurring new investment, companies, labs, products – and plenty of work for those trying to figure out how to regulate it internationally. In recent months, a flurry of activity among international organisations has resulted in the first agreed inter-governmental statement on the ethics of AI, endorsed by the 20 largest industrialised nations that are members of the G20.

There are calls to go further – with international treaties, oversight bodies or coordinated global programmes. And several ministerial conferences, tasks forces and study groups have been churning out a series of studies and policy statements – from Montreal, Brussels, Beijing and beyond.

Each mission board consists of 15 experts, including the chair. They will identify the first possible specific missions on cancer, climate change, healthy oceans, climate-neutral cities and healthy soil and food by the end of 2019. In addition, for each mission an assembly will be established, gathering a larger number of high-level experts. The assemblies provide an additional pool of ideas, knowledge and expertise that will be actively called upon to contribute to the success of the five missions.

The European Commission has launched a call for proposals with €35 million available aimed to support the development of analysis of health images for cancer diagnostics. The European Commission has launched a call for proposals with €35 million available aimed to support the development of analysis of health images for cancer diagnostics based on Artificial Intelligence, as well as other tools and analytics focused on the prevention, prediction and treatment of the most common forms of cancer. The call is part of the Horizon 2020 programme, through which the Commission is investing a total of €177 million on the 'Digital Transformation of Health and Care' and 'Trusted digital solutions and Cybersecurity in Health and Care'.

Life Programme 2019 - Increased Submission Rates

More than 1000 concept notes were submitted to the 'Traditional Projects' call under the LIFE environment sub-programme, which closed on 20 June 2019.

The submissions request a total of €2.2bn from the EU up from €1.8bn for the same call in 2019. 54% of the submissions are for 'environment and resource efficiency' projects, 31% for 'nature and biodiversity', and 15% for the area of 'environmental governance and information'. The European Commission will now evaluate the concept notes and inform applicants of the results in October. Successful applicants will then have until February 2020 to submit their full project proposals.

EU Sets Out Forest Restoration Framework

The Commission has adopted a Communication on a framework of actions intended to protect and restore the world's forests, in an effort to support the biodiversity and industry that rely on them and to help fight climate change.

1.3 million square kilometres of forest was lost worldwide between 1990 and 2016, equivalent to around 800 football fields every hour, primarily due to demand for food, feed, biofuel, timber and other commodities. The proposed measures seek to fight both the supply and demand side of these issues by enhancing international cooperation, promoting sustainable finance, making better use of land and resources, creating sustainable jobs, managing the supply chain and targeting research and data collection, as well as assessing possible new regulatory measures to minimise the impact of EU consumption on deforestation and forest degradation.

Schools and Media Literacy Critical for Teen Refugees' Social Wellbeing

For a teenage refugee starting a new life in Europe, going to school and using digital media form a big part of navigating an unfamiliar society. But appropriate interventions at school and online could help them feel more at home in a new country. A quarter of the migrants and refugees who entered Europe last year were children, while nearly 15,000 refugee children were resettled here – mostly in the UK, France and Sweden. Helping these teenagers to feel socially supported is crucial to their wellbeing and creating a stable future, according to Dr An Verelst, a clinical psychologist at Ghent University in Belgium. 'If your emotional wellbeing is better, then you are better able to study, achieve academically, find a job and build a family,' she said.

Juncker Plan: €800 million for innovative small and medium-sized businesses in eleven countries

The European Investment Bank (EIB) and ProCredit Group are providing €800 million to innovative small and medium-sized companies (SMEs), under the European Fund for Strategic Investments (EFSI), the core element of the Investment Plan for Europe, or "Juncker Plan", and the InnovFin SME Guarantee Facility. The financing will target companies using new technologies and producing new products in one of the eleven countries where the facility is available (Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Georgia, Germany, Greece, Moldova, the Republic of North Macedonia, Romania, Serbia and Ukraine). A press release is available here. As of June 2019, the Juncker Plan has mobilised nearly €410 billion of additional investment. The Plan is currently supporting 952,000 small and medium businesses across Europe.
